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COMMODORE'S COLUMN

At our last Board meeting we finally approved budgets for the fiscal year. I was not willing to approve running at a deficit, and so regrettably have authorized increases to the Bar prices and storage fees in the yard and club house. In last months Pilot I wrote that we had discussed raising Bar prices and had decided to not do that. I am afraid that in the end fiscal responsibility outweighed the embarrassment of reversing that decision.

The new storage fees will come into effect at the next billing cycle, and are:

Lockers – Small/Large	\$12/18 per quarter.
Yard Boat Storage	\$55
In-House boat storage	\$18
Windsurfer Storage	\$15
Canoe and Kayak Yard Storage	\$15
Laser Yard Storage	\$18
Rowing Scull Yard Storage	\$30

LETTER FROM SAYULITA

It is scary watching men building anything in Mexico. Take Casa Outhouse. It really isn't an outhouse in the true meaning of the word; it's a small bedroom we are building between the house and the pool.

With all the outside walls finished, it's time to put up the beams that will eventually hold up the roof of curved low fired tiles. The beams are thick wood, maybe 6 inches by three inches and there are 10 of them for a building that's 12 feet across. It is sensationally over-engineered. If it weren't canted for the rain, I would think it could support a helicopter. Now all the beams are in place, anchored in by long nails of rebar.

The young man who puts the beams in place dances across the outside walls, about 6' thin. He has the agility of a tight rope artist, all the while juggling an electric drill, large pieces of rebar, a ruler and a hammer. I liked watching him, but I was afraid I would jinx him and he would fall. I gave them several rounds of Diet Coke; giving them beer would be problematic. They all do very hard work but they seem content with getting it done.

Today, we went into town and rented a car. First thing I did was to get some wall paint to paint around our carved stone plaque of 'Our Lady of Carmine.' YOUTH SAILING SUMMER PROGRAM HEAD INSTRUCTOR SEARCH UNDERWAY

The Inverness Yacht Club seeks a Head Instructor for their Summer Youth Sailing Program. The program begins on 6/22/08 with 8 weeks of employment ending on 8/21. There is one unpaid week in the middle of two three week sessions. There are 30 sailors in each session ranging in age from 10-16 under the direction of a Head Instructor with 5 other US Sailing Certified instructors. The younger sailors are in El Toroís and Optiís. The more experienced sailors are in CFJís and Laserís. Club Flying Scotts are used on heavier air days and for trips to adjoining beaches. The program is rich in tradition, focused on fun, enjoying Tomales Bay, and includes instruction and experience in racing. This is a supervisory position working with and organizing experienced instructors who know the program well. NEW RACING RULES

As some of you may have noticed there is a new set of rules for 2009-2012. For a really succinct description of which rules have changed and how, you can go to Scuttlebutt on line and read an article by Dave Perry at this address: <http://www.sailingscuttlebutt.com/news/09/0108/>

I cannot reprint his article but here are some of the headings:

*Rule 17.2 (On the Same Tack; Proper Course) has been deleted.

*New three length zone; no more "about to round a mark."

*A new definition called Mark-Room.

*New rule 18 cleans up some confusion caused in the previous rule 18.

*Rule 18.4 (gybing at a leeward mark) does not apply at a gate mark.

*No more zones around "obstructions."

*Rule 20 (Room to Tack at an Obstruction) has a small but important change.

Brush up. The new rules are already in effect and are changing the way yachts approach marks and get around a course!
